Annual Plan Progress Update

We're pleased to share that key actions across our strategic Pou are well underway, with steady progress being made.

Ako - Learning

- We've applied for additional staffing to support Structured Literacy in 2026, building on the success of this year's programme.
- Reviews of English and Maths have provided clear next steps for consistency across the school.

Professional Development

- Staff have engaged in targeted PLD in Maths and Structured Literacy, with growing confidence in curriculum delivery.
- Weekly Te Reo sessions continue for all classroom teachers.
- Staff have participated in Kāhui Ako collaboration, SENCO development, and curriculum leadership initiatives.

Whanaungatanga - Relationships

- Year 8 transition visits to colleges are underway.
- Learning Conversations were well attended, with 90% family participation.
- A review of te ao Māori implementation shows positive progress.
- Team newsletters were shared via HERO, and several families attended open mornings.

Oranga - Wellbeing

- Acknowledgements for Northland Champ expectations are planned before term's end
- Senior students are leading various initiatives including Kapa Haka, sports, reading club, and lunchtime activities.
- The Seasons for Growth programme continues to support students through change and transition.
